

We are Gearing Up!!

Believe it or not...Medicare D Season is just around the corner and we are already taking steps to ensure a smooth enrollment process. As many who have already been through an enrollment period realize, it is easy to see how getting an early start can be extremely beneficial both to you and can make all of the Strom staff feel comfortable knowing that all persons are accounted for.



Strom will follow similar practices for the 2018 coverage year as we have in prior years. We will again provide the famous "Yellow Medication Forms" to be filled out and returned to Strom. To ensure that we don't overlook any medication information, **NO** forms other than our standard yellow forms will be accepted. "Other" forms include pharmacy printouts, nursing home printouts, even typed or handwritten lists (even though they may be very neatly printed!) and please... no verbal lists. The Yellow Medication forms require the EXACT Medications, dosage amounts, and how often they are taken. (Exact Medications are detailed...if you take an extended release medication that includes the "ER" after it... make sure that is noted. Also, a medication such as Potassium could be potassium chloride, potassium citrate, etc.) A lack of detailed information can result in enrolling in a great plan versus a mediocre one, costing you more at the pharmacy. Look at your prescription bottles to make sure of what you are taking.



Also, on the form note whether you are willing to take a generic form of the medication. Nearly all of the plans are much more favorable to generics. However, if you request brand names, we can show you the best plans for those, too. The Yellow Medication Form has a place for your name....it should be written as it is on your

Medicare card. There is a street address line as well as a mailing address. Most plans will not accept enrollments that do not have a street address even if you live in one of our smaller rural areas, and your address is a Box number: you will have to give a physical address (can be found on most real estate tax bills). Because we are covering both Henderson and Warren Counties, be sure to write in which county you reside.



After completely filling out the Yellow Medication Form, please date it and either mail it or bring it in to Strom Center. Appointments will be assigned as the forms are received.

Forms are available now and may be submitted by the 2nd week of September, however plans will not be available until October, and hopefully we can start doing pre-enrollments then.

Some other items to take into consideration: *The numbers of persons eligible to enroll in plans is increasing tremendously....Most appointments will be made to review plans every 30 – 45 minutes, so the need to be on time is critical. The staff will do our best to stay on track. Unfortunately, during those set appointments we won't be able to assist with other matters BUT we will be absolutely be willing and happy to make a different appointment time available for any and all other issues. So...when a staff member calls to set up a Medicare D review time and you have other items to discuss, please let that be known so we can best accommodate you. We will have extended hours and days to ensure all persons who submit a yellow form will be assisted. Even though



enrollment for Medicare D ends on December 7th, Strom will make appointments **only through November 30th**; the last few days prior to December 7th is used by staff to confirm that all enrollments have been

processed.



* If we do an enrollment for you and your doctor changes your prescriptions...let us know that as soon as possible...we can review your plan and if another plan looks more favorable, we will be happy to switch you...that is permissible. However, the plan in which you are enrolled as of December 7th at midnight is the plan you will be covered by all of 2018.

* A fact that has proven to be true over the years is that the plan that is the best for you in the current year may be the absolute worst for you in 2018....plans change, and sometimes big time! Every, every, every January persons come in very upset because their costs have increased only to find out that their prior year's plan went south! And the worst part is that it is too late to change!



* Also, if you are swayed by TV and /or other advertisements received in the mail, telling you that a certain plan is THE one to choose...don't believe it! The plan best for YOU is the plan which covers your particular medications and allows you to purchase from the pharmacy of YOUR choice! Strom can input all of YOUR information and present you with a list of plans from which to choose.

Don't worry...if you are a 'newbee' to Medicare and/ or need a refresher course in any or all aspects of Medicare, or if you are currently under an employer plan and would like to compare that plan to a Medicare D plan, you will

have your concerns resolved during our September and October Medicare meetings when we cover all of this information as well as information on new 'donut' hole costs, new plans available as well as many other changes / updates concerning Medicare-related issues, so be watching for future newsletters covering dates and times of those informational meetings!

Again, bringing up the subject of Medicare D at this time may seem premature, but it is necessary to start thinking of it nowThanksgiving and thoughts of Christmas come during Medicare D season but the December 7th deadline is not flexible...

One Additional Note....As most already are aware, one of our staff workers, Pam Allen has been facing some medical challenges; the date she will be

returning to us is uncertain, but it will not be at the beginning of the Medicare enrollment season. However, besides myself (Carol McCreary) we have three persons who are certified SHIP / Medicare trained: Kathy Ferrenburg, Erica Little, and Lynda Accardo.

Among the many spectators lining Main Street during the Independence Day celebration in Oquawka were Deloris Haynes and her daughter, Debbie Barry.

"This parade's been going on for years," said Barry, who resides near Fort Worth, Texas. "That's why I come home this time of year - to see the parade."

A 1978 graduate of Union High School, Barry has fond memories of growing up in Oquawka, a village she describes as "fun, small and friendly."

"It's a good community," added Debbie's friend, Rose Garner, who also graduated from Union (now West Central High School), in 1979. "Everyone sticks together and helps out those in need."

The women also agreed that Oquawka was a much busier place in the 1970s.

"On Saturdays the Main Street here would be packed," Garner recalled. "We'd sit by the diner and the levee. I was born and raised in Gladstone and spent a lot of time fishing and boating, and we'd go out on the island and camp."

After Shorty contracted encephalitis and became seriously ill, the couple began making regular trips to Warren Achievement Center and Strom Center in Monmouth.



Then I met Shorty in Burlington and we got married in Davenport. We traveled all over the U.S. with Chicago Bridge & Iron for many years before moving here.






