

UPCOMING JULY TRIAD....

The June, 2018 Warren County Triad welcomed Monmouth Police Chief Joe Switzer as our guest speaker. Joe gave a brief history

of his roots with Monmouth. Both of his parents and grandparents lived in Monmouth. Joe was born and raised here and attended Monmouth schools. He served in the U.S. Army and later joined the Monmouth Police Department in 1989 as a dispatcher. Joe has held nearly every position in the police department in his 25 years there. Joe shared, "I want to help our community, I care what goes on here." He states that the police department is a service-based organization; a business that is customer oriented. He wants and expects his staff to be friendly and helpful to all cultures and all populations. He remarked that he very much enjoys his job.

Several questions were presented to Joe that are community concerns. Parking places being used by business staff members hinder the access by elderly who wish to shop and enter businesses. Joe said he will share that issue with the

Chamber of Commerce. Another concern is the problem of high volume music and other noises coming from vehicles in residential areas, many late into the evening. Joe suggested steps the public can take and information required for a complaint to be made. One attendee questioned whether there is any leash law for cats and the answer is no.

Opioid is a major concern in many communities and Chief Switzer shared that it isn't a major problem at this time but he expects that it very well may increase in the future. He also stated that illegal immigration is "not any bigger problem here than elsewhere". Various scams were discussed following Police Chief Switzer's presentation. Refreshments were served.







NEW MEDICARE CARD ARRIVING!

Several persons have come into Strom Center and / or called stating they have received their new Medicare Cards. The announcement was made some time ago that the cards would be arriving beginning April, 2018. The cards are randomly sent, so you may not receive yours at the same time as a relative or neighbor.

Once you receive your new card, destroy your old card and start using the new one immediately. Only share your card with health care providers and/ or persons you can trust to work with Medicare on your behalf.

The cards are much more secure than the older cards as they do not provide any valuable personal information such as Social Security numbers. The claim number issued to you is a unique one containing both letters and numbers. The great thing about the new card is that if it is lost, you (or someone you know and trust) may print out another card on the computer with your correct information; or you, your doctor or other trusted person may be able to look up your Medicare number online (this will be a great advantage for Medicare D enrollments). For those persons who are enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan such as an HMO or PPO, still keep that card (along with your new Medicare card) and use it whenever you need healthcare services.

All persons with Medicare should receive their new cards by April, 2019...so be patient! It will arrive maybe later than sooner, but it will arrive!



RULES OF THE ROAD REFRESHER COURSE...

The FREE Rules of the Road Refresher Course is offered by the Illinois Secretary of State's Office at the Warren County Public Library (62 Public Square, Monmouth, Illinois.) A representative from Jesse White's office will update drivers on current rules of the road, review the vision and driving exams, and prepare drivers for the general written and road sign exams.

This course is intended for drivers over the age of 16 who are preparing for their renewal exam. This class is FREE and open to the public, but registration is required.
