FOR THOSE PERSONS ENROLLED IN AETNA MEDICARE RX SELECT MEDICARE D PLAN....

January 1st of each year seems to present itself with any challenges or concerns persons may have with the Medicare D plans in which they are enrolled. Whether it be deductibles, premium billing, getting used to a new plan, or other issues, we can usually smooth out those wrinkles in short order. However, with the possible closing of one of the local pharmacies In Monmouth, we are hit with a new concern. (Very Unfortunate that news of this did not come until just a week or so ago...long after Open Enrollment ended). For persons with Medicare D Plan "AETNA MEDICARE RX SELECT", there is only one Preferred Pharmacy in Monmouth. There are other preferred pharmacies in other towns, but only one Preferred pharmacy in Monmouth for the AETNA MEDICARE RX SELCT Medicare D plan.

What does a Preferred Pharmacy mean??

A Preferred Pharmacy is one which is considered by your Medicare D Plan to provide the least expensive cost for your medications. Each of the Medicare D Plans available for this current year have a preferred pharmacy.....not all Medicare D plans have the same preferred pharmacies. Should you go to a non-preferred pharmacy the cost of the medications will usually not be as low or may even be full cost if the pharmacy does not accept your Medicare D plan. If you enrolled in the AETNA MEDICARE RX SELECT Medicare D Plan and will not have easy access to a preferred pharmacy, please call Strom Center (309 734 5677). There may be some options available.....When you call, please have your Aetna Card available.

Again, even though Strom Center was not informed nor did we have any hint of this pharmacy's possibility of closing, we realize it may present a hardship for several enrollees....for that we are sorry...

STROM CENTER'S POLICY ON WEATHER-RELATED CLOSINGS.......We have certainly had our share of bad weather lately...so much so that it required our center's closing. Strom Center's



policy is that if local schools are closed, Strom Center will also be closed. In addition, the local radio station (WRAM, 1330 AM) and WMOI (97.7) will be informed of our closing and that information will be announced. Also, the flashing sign in the front window of Strom will show closing information. Staff members can usually access their daily appointment calendars from home, and will attempt to contact clients to reschedule. As mentioned earlier in this newsletter, soon we will have the capability to record appropriate messages on our new phone system, but it is not set up at this time.

Monmouth College to offer Free Tax Return

Assistance......Monmouth College will provide the VITA (Volunteer Income Tax

Assistance) program for area residents. It will run from February 4 through the end of the tax season, April 15th. The program covers both Federal and State returns and is provided for on a first come first served basis.

To be eligible to participate in the program, taxpayers may have a maximum annual income of up to \$63,000 for single filers and up to \$101,000 for joint filers. VITA does not prepare complicated returns.


BINGO DAYS IN OQUAWKA.....
