Because of the recent closing of Shopko Pharmacy, persons who are enrolled in Aetna Medicare Rx Select would not have access locally to a preferred However, Medicare has pharmacy. allowed Axlines Pharmacy to become a preferred pharmacy for that plan. This is great news especially for persons who do not drive and / or do not want to venture out of town during dangerously cold weather to preferred pharmacies to pick up their prescriptions.

For persons who are enrolled in other plans (even Aetna plans OTHER THAN Aetna Medicare Rx Select) nothing has changed.

Just a note: we have attempted to contact every person who Strom enrolled in the Aetna Medicare Rx Select plan for the current year. However, we may have missed some persons who did not come to Strom to have their plan reviewed and thus stayed on Aetna Medicare Rx Select

plan from the prior year, OR persons who may have enrolled themselves in the Aetna Medicare Rx Select. Hopefully, through this newsletter and / or word or mouth they now know of their pharmacy options...

Carol Lee, OSF Hospice nurse was the February TRIAD speaker. The OS Health Care team accompanied her. Each person was introduced and a brief summary of what service each

To utilize OSF services, one must be evaluated, their needs assessed and a doctor must order services.

OSF provides a multitude of services. Besides programs such as Hospice, Home Health Care, as well as other programs, a new program that OSF is implementing is Palliative Care with Chronic Diseases. The program goal is to help keep one out of the hospital. OSF also offers grief support through groups which meet weekly and are open to the public.

Carol McCrery shared the most recent scams; the Social Security reported 3,200 complaints in 2017 resulting in monetary loss of \$210,000. In 2018 more than 35,000 persons were scammed by Social Security scams resulting in over a 10 million dollar loss.

## YOU may be eligible for LOW INCOME SUBSIDY (Also referred to as Extra Help)

One of the most beneficial program to Medicare-eligible individuals is the Low Income Subsidy Program also known as 'Extra Help" The Medicare Part D Extra-Help or Low-Income Subsidy (LIS) program helps pay both your monthly Medicare prescription drug plan premiums and Medicare Part D drug costs. The amount of assistance received through Extra Help depends on your income and asset level. If you qualify for Medicaid you automatically qualify for Medicare Part D Extra Help.

### Eligibility requirements are for Full Extra Help is:

- Annual income for single persons is \$16,862
- Annual income for married couples is \$22,829
   Resources cannot exceed \$9,060 for an individual or \$14,340 for a married couple who live together to receive full Extra Help

(Resources include: bank accounts, stocks and bonds. Resources do not include: your home, your car, or life insurance policies.)

### Eligibility requirements for Partial Extra Help is:

- Annual income for single persons is \$\$18,862
- Annual income for married couples is \$25,365
   Resources cannot exceed \$14,100 for an individual or \$28,150 for a married couple who live together to receive partial Extra Help.

(Resources include: bank accounts, stocks and bonds. Resources do not include: your home, your car, or life insurance policies.)

If you qualify for LIS you may pay anywhere from \$1.25 to \$3.40 for a generic medication and \$3.80 to \$8.50 for a brand name.

If you think you may be eligible for Low Income Subsidy, please feel free to call Strom Center (309 734 4560) for an appointment.
