What is the Amplified Phone Program? It is a program provided by Illinois



Iowa Center for Independent Living which provides equipment designed specifically for people who are having difficulty hearing on the standard or cell phones. The phones provided by this program are superior in amplification, features, adjustability, and durability. And they're free!

For persons signing up for the Free phones:

1. You will choose from the equipment that ITAC has specified for the program. There are many phones from which to choose...all with different features.

- You will own the equipment that you choose.
- All equipment comes with a 3-year Warranty and will be repaired or replaced free of charge.* You are responsible ONLY for return shipping cost to the repair vendor.
- 4. You may receive a new piece of equipment every 3 years and keep the equipment you already have

Appointments are required for this program. Persons will be able to try out the various phones; amplifiers for already owned cell phones are also available.

WE ARE GEARING UP FOR MEDICARE D SEASON!!!

Strom Center is gearing up for our upcoming Medicare D Season which is just around the corner! We will be hosting several Informational Meetings both in Henderson and Warren Counties... information will be the same for both so you may attend the meeting which fits best into your schedule....We do not have access to the actual plans at this time but will have that information in early October. The dates and times for the meetings will be included in our October edition of *Strom Center News*. What we do know is that the enrollments are going to take a bit longer time to conduct. We will still be requiring persons to complete our Yellow Medication Forms prior to appointments. The forms may be either mailed brought into one of our sites (Oquawka or Monmouth). Once received the form will be numbered according to when it was received and appointments will be scheduled accordingly. The Yellow Medication Forms are available upon request; a form may be mailed or you may pick one up. Appointments will be scheduled once Strom receives the actual Plans from Medicare.

It is EXTREMELY important to review plans each year; plan formularies change, as do premiums and deductibles. As we have stated many times before... the plan that works best for you in the current year may be the absolute worst for you for next year. Reviewing plans and possible changing plans can save thousands of dollars (no exaggeration!!) Last year between Warren County and Henderson County close to \$800,000 in savings was realized...
